Establishing A Health Care Power Of Attorney

Indiana grants an individual the right to dictate who is in charge of their health care and well-being if they are ever health care power of attorney should be willing to abide by all of your wishes.

An estate planning attorney can help you and your selected health care representative create an advance directive. An advance directive is a contract between you and your health care representative or “attorney-in-fact.” The advance directive ensures you retain as much power as possible, even after your health care representative takes over the decision-making. An advance directive is also beneficial should you decide there are certain people you do not want to be able to make decisions regarding your health care.

Establish A Health Care Proxy

If you wish to retain control of your life until the end, establishing a health care power of attorney is in your best interests. If you have not named a health care representative and you become incapacitated, the decisions made regarding your health care are out of your control. You need to create and document a solid plan for you to maintain as much control over your health and life as possible.
